TRINITY PIPE ORGAN REBUILD

This summer we are aiming to complete the rebuild of our historic pipe organ. In order for us to do this, we need your help urgently. The estimated cost of this project is \$25,000....and the good news is that we have already raised \$8,300 since last September.

PHASE ONE: (purchase, dismantle and bring the Shubenacadie pipe organ and console to Trinity, Digby). **Completed in April 2010.**

PHASE TWO: (unplug the 'old' console and re-wire the 1939 Casavant console to the existing Trinity pipe organ). **Completed in June 2010.**

PHASE THREE: (2 or 3 weeks of solid work to completely remove the existing pipes, swell organ housing, blower and racking from the organ chamber before rebuilding to a new design. The rebuild will include a (larger) blower, and utilize pipes, windchests, and other materials from both organs. Jean Francois (JF) Mailhot of Peninsula Organs Inc., New Brunswick, and several volunteers under his direction will do this work. Finally, JF will voice, regulate and tune the whole organ which will have 12 stops over three divisions - Great (6), Swell (4) and Pedal (2) – operated from the console which has several couplers, adjustable pistons, swell and crescendo pedals, etc. to enhance the sound and to assist the player. **To be completed this summer.**

WHY ARE WE DOING THIS?

Good music supports good worship, which in turn inspires the whole of Christian life, witness and mission. So, not only will the rebuilt organ be more beautifully sounding, but it will enhance the worship experience and inspire new people to offer their musical gifts. Culture too is important in our community: Trinity has hosted some fine concerts, workshops and inter-church events. Secular concerts are encouraged - Digby's Fundy Chorale, and last October, "Nova Voce" the Provincial Male Voice Choir played to large audiences here. But we want to build our concerts' base still further, and have more people enjoy the space this beautiful heritage building, with its fine acoustics, affords. This is the first of several projects that we will be undertaking in order to make Trinity Church a more inviting place to visit.
