SALE OF PARISH PROPERTY

Diocese of Nova Scotia & Prince Edward Island

The Anglican Church Act, (chapter 130, Acts of Nova Scotia, 1967), (PEI Chapter 53 Bill No. 4- 1972), requires the approval of the Bishop , in writing, before the sale of any parish property, Canon 38 also requires the consent of the Bishop before the sale of parish property.

- All applications must be accompanied by a plan drawn to scale, showing the size of the lot, the road frontage, the ownership of adjacent lands and the location of all buildings thereon;
- 2. A written appraisal of the market value of the property signed be a competent appraiser who certifies that he/she has no financial interest in the proposed sale or purchase.
- 3. A copy of the Resolution of the Parochial Corporation certified by the Parish Council. (see form of Resolution Page 2.2.1a)

The application must be in writing and provide the following:

- (a) Particulars of the Deed under which the Parish claims ownership;
- (b) A description of all buildings thereon, including type of heating, plumbing, water installation, etc.;
- (c) Amount of the Municipal assessment for the current year;
- (d) Particulars of any unpaid mortgage, taxes and other liens;
- (e) The name of proposed purchaser and the use to which the property will be put after the sale;
- (f) Proposed sale price;
- (g) Reasons for the sale;
- (h) Date of congregational meeting held to consider the sale and decision taken;
- (I) Particulars of how the proceeds of the sale will be used.

NOTE: No agreement should be signed, no option given or no deposit accepted until approval has been given by the Bishop.
