



## SEASON OF CREATION 2021 - A HOME FOR ALL? RENEWING THE OIKOS OF GOD




Amid crises that have shaken our world, the global Christian family has been awakened to the urgent need to heal our relationships with creation and with each other during the ecumenical *Season of Creation* (September 1<sup>st</sup> to October 4<sup>th</sup>), with its theme this year of *A Home for All? Renewing the Oikos of God*.

This theme for the *Season of Creation 2021* parallels that of our diocesan Anglican Church Women for 2021/22, *Community: Care... Courage... Compassion,* with both themes focusing on renewing our world as an interconnected and interdependent global community. We learn in Genesis that God put us all under the same "domed" roof – we are all in this house, the *oikos of God* – a "beloved community", the latter as expressed by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. It is a community in which all of life are equal members. We know that this oikos of God, this home for all, is now in danger.

During the 2021 Season of Creation, thousands of Christians on six continents will get together for a time of restoration and hope, a jubilee for our Earth, and to discover radically new ways of living with creation. More than ever before, the global Christian family will unite to pray and take action for our common home. This global celebration began in 1989 with the Ecumenical Patriarchate's recognition of the Day of Prayer for Creation (Sept. 1) and is now embraced by the wide ecumenical community. Prayer is a powerful experience and tool to raise awareness and foster transformational relations and ministry.

We have forgotten that we all live in the household of God, the oikos, the "beloved community". Our fundamental interconnectedness has been at best overlooked, at worst deliberately denied. It is the hope and prayer of the *Season of Creation 2021* Advisory Committee that we can become again this "beloved community" of intentional discipleship. It will take courage, but we can be champions to renew all of life in the "Beloved Community", the Oikos of God, so that all of creation are welcomed and nurtured under a "dome" of care and compassion.
