This year's theme is dedicated to the legacy of Archbishop Tutu - Eco-Ubuntu

The Season of Creation begins on 1 September, with the World Day of Prayer for Creation, and ends on 4 October, the day on which the church remembers St Francis of Assisi, Patron Saint of Ecology.

This season offers us wonderful opportunities for creativity and collaboration as we celebrate God, hear again that we are called to be carers of creation and recommit ourselves to this end. Our theme this year seeks to honour the late Archbishop Desmond Tutu and focusses on his life's work of seeing goodness in everyone and reminding us that we are all connected. Our weekly themes this year bring the theology of Ubuntu into conversation with the call for ecological justice and offer us an opportunity to preach a message of hope during this Season of Creation:

On the Horizon . . . Synod 2022: We Shall All Be Changed

The Anglican Church Women Board will be featured at our Diocesan Synod 2022 (Oct. 14 - 16) with a static display and a short presentation, both emphasizing the journey the Board has been engaged with and how it dovetails with the theme of Synod: We Shall All Be Changed. One can tell that the Anglican Church Women theme for 2022/23, New and Wondrous Ways (from the last verse of the Anglican Church Women hymn, The Love of Jesus Calls Us - # 434), gives notice of new ways of "doing business". The many factors that necessitate new and wondrous ways of being is what the Board has been engaged with for several months and will continue to be so in the months ahead. A global pandemic was and is the catalyst for a changed future, but the underlying factors predate Covid 19. A full Board report for the Synod Convening Circular has been submitted that shows clearly how attuned the Anglican Church Women Board is with the Synod theme: We Shall All Be Changed.
