The Mass Casualty Commission (MCC) Report of March 2023 is challenging "men to start acknowledging the realities of gender-based violence and do their part." The Report is unequivocal in affirming that Gender-based Violence (GBV) is an "epidemic": the scope of the problem is "sweeping, toxic, and unhealthy". It is compared to the Covid 19 pandemic, as it is a "public health emergency that warrants a meaningful, whole of society response."
