Submit a request* to the Bishop including:	
	Description of parish preparation.
	How this ministry is communicated to parishioners receiving Home Communion.
	Information about the character, calling and competency of the lay minister(s) requesting
	licensing.
2. Rector's Authorization (or Priest-in-charge)	
	Rector must authorize the distribution each time Communion is offered.
	Preferably, Communion is distributed on the same day as the parish Eucharist.
	Elements should be taken directly from the parish celebration, reinforcing the connection to
	the gathered community.
3. Licensing Lay Distributors	
	Lay distributors may be Licensed Lay Ministers and other trusted parish lay people.
	Apply* for the specific license for <i>Administration of Communion from the Reserved</i>
	Sacrament (not included in standard licenses).
	License is valid for 3 years and renewable with written request from Rector and Parish
	Council.
	quirements for Lay Distributors
	Must be acknowledged by the congregation and approved by Parish Council.
	Provide a Criminal Record and Vulnerable Sector Check.
	Comply with SaferChurch policies for home visits.
	Be a regular communicant, at least 16 years old, and sincere in faith.
	Be commissioned publicly and receive the Bishop's license during worship.
	Have pastoral skills and be willing to serve as part of a ministry team.
